Sir William Jardine & W.H. Lizars Original Birds from The Naturalist's Library

Published 1833-1845 by Sir William Jardine and engraved by W.H. Lizars, “The Naturalist’s Library” became immensely popular when introduced in the 19th century. Forty volumes were produced containing over 1300 hand-colored plates studying four subjects, including: ornithology, mammalia, entomology, and ichthyology.
